## 2024 PICNIC CHANGES

- 1. Joe (74), our picnic committee's co-chair, will be the DJ and supervisor of the picnic and has come up with a new layout for the Picnic area.
- 2. All audio speakers will be at one end (the left-facing entrance), and the other end (the right-facing entrance) will be a quiet area.
- 3. The shelter's graphic layout has been updated. I'll put it on the website and email it to you in the following newsletter.
- 4. Photos will return to the back of the shelter as they have for most of the previous ten years. We always had good pictures at that location.
- 5. The next picture class will assemble to the left of the shelter area behind the DJ Music counter.
- 6. The traffic flow graphic illustration has also been update.
- 7. The Purple Jacket Award will begin this year.
- 8. We will continue taking pictures from the oldest class first.
- 9. The food tables will have lines on both sides of the table, with the oldest classmates eating first.
- 10. After photos, alums will join the food line forming at the back of the shelter near the food tables.

Our committee now has optimized the internal shelter layout and traffic flow for pictures and meals. However, suggestions to improve our annual all-alum picnic are always welcome.

\*\* THE NEED TO RSVP \*\*

On this tenth picnic anniversary, adding your name to the REGISTRATION LIST will be necessary. I have added the capability of preprinting a name tag from the available REGISTRATION database information. I have already updated the prior RSVP form to a REGISTRATION FORM. However, the website menus and other items still reflect the name RSVP. I will update all of these before the picnic. Having all alums planning on attending register for the event will speed up our front desk processing. Registered alums and guests with preprinted name tags will bypass the regular sign-in line.

Remember, we need a list of attendees to the picnic for safety purposes. If you cannot RSVP or REGISTER with our online form, contact Kathy at 952-818-0677 or Bonnie at 952-432-3947. They will either enter the information into the RSVP database or contact me with the information.

The Picnic Registration database only has four fields: class year, first name, last name, and the number of attendees. No personal information, like phone numbers, emails, addresses, etc., is collected. This registration database helps the picnic committee plan for the annual picnic. I thank you for registering to attend the picnic on helpalf of the entire picnic committee. As usual

if you still need to register, do not let that stop you from attending to meet up or meet some alum friends from your class or other classes.

The RSVP form has been updated to a PICNIC REGISTRATION FORM to allow the printing of name tags. Therefore, the form requires one name at a time to be entered. Enter one name and the number attending as One (1), then submit the registration. It will return a success page with a red button to return to the registration form to add additional names. You can use this cycle until you enter all the names of the people coming with you. You will use the form twice if it is just an alum and their spouse. Instructions are also listed on the form.

PLEASE REGISTER ASAP if you are planning to attend.

Preprinted Name Tags will derived from the RSVP database information. Your cooperation will help us with planning the picnic. It will also expedite our check-in process.

SENIOR INTERNET SCAMS

WELL, if anyone should know better, it would be me. I am sophisticated with web technology and sales tools. However, I was scammed twice during the last year on nutraceutical pitches. One involved a gummy bear, and the other a sleep aid. I can thank my curiosity and interest in alternative health approaches for getting drawn into the processes. I'm not going to go into details. Still, I have analyzed what both products had in common and where I could make a different decision.

Both products had the following:

- 1. Sophisticated credibility, citing experts and, in one case, even a famous actor I liked.
- 2. No pricing was disclosed on the websites.
- 3. You had to give up all your contact information before seeing the price.
- 4. You had to check a subscribe button to get the best price (which wasn't shown).

In one case, I listened to almost an hour-long pitch despite being told that "the answer" would be forthcoming in only a few minutes. A female friend of mine also had a similar experience.

What you need to know about these two scams

LEAVE if you see a form requesting contact information for a product that looks interesting but has no price. It is a sign of a scam harvesting contact information, even if you fail to continue to order what they are selling.

If you listen to a video sales pictch and are told the answer is coming in three minutes, etc., leave if it doesn't. It is another scam.

In one case, the processor refused my card information, and in the other, I was charged four times what was presented online. This forced me to file a complaint with my bank, which was ultimately resolved in my favor. However, I had to cancel the card and get a new one, which forced me to update several vendors I used my prior card with.

So beware of any online offer that requests contact information before showing you the cost. Also, beware of any video offer that strings you along without giving you what it promises.

SENIOR HEALTH BLOG
